

- The first artists featured are those who are still living and still practicing their skills as an artist.
- Most are professional artists who have degrees in art, and either have studios or work in the profession.
- A few are considered amateurs, with little training, however, their art is quite good from their natural talent.
- The second group are "Legacy" artists that are no longer with us. Their artistic works can still be found, as are their life stories, on the web.

- Cathy is a fine artist and graphic designer specializing in the fields of corporate identity & logo design, print design, and illustration.
- She also does amazing portraits and paintings in many mediums.

- In 1998, she moved her art into the digital world and decided to turn her passion for art into a career. Thus, myartplane.com.


- As all artist, she loves to create, making pottery, painting murals, portraits, and anything else that sits still too long.

- She has worked with children extensively as an art teacher and running an art camp in underprivileged neighborhoods.




- Her art practice is a trail of places she's been and the people she's been with.

Jacob still creates art for himself like the attached portrait to honor the memory of his Great Grandmother, "Nana" Delena June Haaff.










Todd Gladfelter

- Todd has been a Champion of the Mid-Atlantic National Chainsaw Competition for several years and has received awards as "The Best in Show" at national carving completions.




Todd Gladfelter


- Allen is a cartoonist and game artist who is a charter designer for Fat Rascal Games.

- Bryce does illustrations for Lancet Global Health, which is a world organization that specializes in health publications related to disadvantaged populations.




Bryce Gladfelter

- His work can be found on custom Gilson snowboards used in Olympic competition.


Bryce Gladfelter




- Here is an example of Bryce's designs on custom Gilson snow boards.

- Lori Clodfelter is a fulltime studio potter working in Seagrove, NC where she and her husband Geoffrey own and operate the Pottery Road Studio and Gallery.
- The Seagrove area is one of the largest communities of potters with the longest continual history of pottery making in the United States.



Lori started working in clay at the age of 12 at the Gibbs Museum of Art studio in Charleston, SC. She went on to study ceramics and sculpture at Winthrop University.

She works in white stoneware clay locally sourced in Star, NC. The majority of her work is executed in decorative relief and a process called sgraffito, which means "to scratch off." The work is then high fired in a gas reduction kiln.

- Geoffrey was raised in Rossville, GA which is right on the border with Tennessee near Chattanooga.
- Lori was raised in the "Low country" of South Carolina near Charleston.

 Richard Glatfelter, past president of the Casper Glattfelder Association.



- Her Aunt Ida was her first influence into the art world.



- She has an art studio in her home from which she has taught countless private, semi-private and group lessons.
- And has taught at several locations around York and Lancaster Counties.
- She also held a vendor space for many years in Arts Hall during the York Fair.
- Over the years, Maxine has completed a multitude of custom pieces for residents of York and surrounding counties.

- Maxine, taught both of her daughters,
 Gretchen and Becky, to paint when they were
 young, and they continue in the art field
 today.
- Maxine is the first cousin of the Rev. J Richard Glatfelter, past president of the Casper Glattfelter Association.

- Charlynne Hershey
 Tuscany is an artist who specializes in textiles.
- From York county she now lives in Florida.
- She spins her own yarn and then weaves fabric on a hand loom to form artistic creations, some practical like hats and scarves, and others like wall art.



- Charlynne has two spinning wheels obtained from the York county area.
- One made during the first half of the 19th century circa 1830-1840 by German immigrants. Made of mahogany wood, it's fully operational and in very good condition.
- She works daily on the one shown that is not an antique.



- Her fibers of choice are raw wool or alpaca.
- Once she has spun enough yarn for the warp, she threads the reed and then the heddles on the frames.
- The frames are raised up and down by hand to form the shed.
- As the shed changes, she passes the weft yarns in the shuttle through the shed by hand to form the fabric.



- Here are examples of Charlynne's scarves that she made starting from raw fibers.
- Before spinning and weaving, the fibers must be cleaned of excess oils and other animal debris.
- It's quite a task and an art that is nearly lost.



- Raine Clotfelter is known as America's Muralist.
- His murals have a patriotic theme which stems from his career in the Navy.
- His incredible work has been featured on YouTube, TV news and in multiple newspapers and publications.



- Raine Clotfelter joined the Navy in 1983 and in 1984 was selected as the top choice out of all applicants to become an Illustrator Draftsman.
- He served aboard the USS
 Newport, the USS Shenandoah
 and with three different Admiral
 Staffs
- In Iraq he worked in Naval Security where he created artwork to support the Naval Criminal Investigative Services (NCIS) and other commands.






Since retiring from the Navy, he has become known as "America's Muralist". He is a Naval Historian Artist and has created many military, historical and patriotic works of art all over the United States.

In his civilian life he's had the opportunity to work for many prestigious companies such as Disney, Columbia Pictures, Time Warner Brothers, and has designed album covers for many famous country music celebrities.

- Raine is married to his wife Tricia, and they have four children, three girls and a boy.

- She is the owner of Poplar Hollow Studio in Glenville, PA.



- Many of the gourds are grown on the PA farm where she resides with her husband and co-artist, Bob Gladfelter.
- The shape of the gourd is studied to determine what it wants to be. No two gourds are alike having various shapes, sizes and textures.
- Sometimes a piece is created by individually hand-painting a gourd with it's original unaltered shape using layers of acrylic paint with meticulous attention to detail.

- Other times mixed media work is created with paper clay hand-sculpted onto or over the gourd altering its shape and then handpainted.
- A multi-step, hand-rubbed aging technique using an umber wash finishes each piece before sealing and adds to the old fashioned charm.

- Most of the pieces are whimsical and holiday themed.
- The simplicity of country life on the family farm, the changing seasons, an affinity for treasures from a bygone era and holiday traditions are all celebrated in her work.

- Bob and she have three grown sons, and a loyal rescued dog named Jax, who keep her company in the studio.
- When she is not painting or sculpting, she enjoys her gardens, boating, cooking, reading and gatherings with friends & family, especially with her granddaughters.




- Holly Ann Burns is a California artist who has strong ties to the Glattfelder family.

- Presently she is rebuilding that site in WordPress with a full gallery of Mary Ann's art.






- Holly is married to Daryl Burns and they live in the Los Angeles area. (Desert Palm)

 Magazine, a popular resource for baby boomers on line.





- She is the daughter of the late artist Elizabeth "Libby" Glatfelter.




- The daughter of Elizabeth Glatfelter and George Kegler, Cassandra was raised in Philadelphia.

- Their apparel and hand bags are made with artisan craftsmanship from the best fabrics and materials.




- Urbanmammal is graphic design and branding company that she operates from home online.

Rachel L. Gladfelter


- Rachel L. Gladfelter is an artist that specializes in prints done on textiles and handmade paper.
- She is the Director of Pace Paper in New York City, one of Pace Prints studios.




- At Pace Prints, master printers collaborate with artists in selecting and printing in mediums that are best suited to fulfill the artists' intentions, including a variety of processes.

- Along with mom Lindell, dad Kevin, brother Seth, and she, they were a farm family growing up in Felton, York County as were her grandparents.




- Rachel was born in August of 1981 in York County.

- Rachel is single.




- Max Clotfelter is a cartoonist of some renown and is known for his unique scraggly and quirky style.

- He has a BFA from the Savannah College of Art and Design.




- Kyler Clodfelter is a professional comic book artist.

- Kyler lives in the Metro Detroit area with His wife, Jenni and their pets Dash and Leo.




- Kyler Is a very talented comic book artist and loves the superheroes and draws them often.

- "We are all here to share our skills and make a difference in each others lives" she said of the experience.




- Another passionate cause Cheyenne has adopted stems from her mom who passed away from Chronic Kidney Disease.

- She was born in May of 1991.
- She is the daughter of Nicholas, and the late Janet Gladfelter and she has a sister Misty McCaffery.

- All of his work is paper, cut out with scissors and adhered with glue.




- Cory is also into "Punk" rock music and plays guitar and sings in his band, "Rusty Pump".

 - "Flail & wail & spit & spew. Taking punk back to it's roots into the future on a mission to reveal dimensions thought to be unknown and unreal."




- Cory Gladfelter's new switchblade artwork portrays the universe rearranged, collaged, "in all its atrociousness."

- All of Gene's paintings sold online or in galleries are pre-owned. There is nothing out there that is past 1980.









- Mary Ann Glatfelter's development as an artist began as a fifteen year old with a good sketching hand.
- She continued to study art all through the 50's and 60's and in 1965 Mary Ann received first honorable mention in the state-wide "Old Mills of Pennsylvania" exhibit hung at York College.
- In 1966 until 1972 she was a student of Paul Childlaw, the famous abstract impressionist.
- After refusing opportunities for one and two person shows during the last three years of life, Mary Ann arranged for one at the Promenade Gallery just four days before her death.

- That show did go on.
- In the days before the gallery opening, the Rev. J. Richard Glatfelter (who was a president of our association) and his family were doing many of the things they would not have done if Mary Ann were there.
- They were packing pictures, hanging them and preparing for the March 21 opening of a show with 38 of Mary Ann's acrylics and collages at the Promenade Gallery in Kearney Arts, Promenade.
- But they were doing it without Mary Ann who died Feb. 25 after a brief illness outside of Cincinnati.
- Her family decided to go ahead with the show, "because she would've wanted it."

A Recent Story



- Miranda Brady inherited this painting and reached out to Julia Glatfelter asking who the artist is and where she could find more work and information related to this painting.
- Julia reached out to Larry Gladfelter who reached out to Harry Gladfelter who was doing research on Glattfelders in Art.
- Harry quickly recognized the style and initials of Mary Ann and made contact with Holly Burns, Mary Ann's daughter who then contacted Miranda Brady.


- Sidney was a quilter of some renowned and her works were known in York County at various Quilting events and Fairs.
- She was born on January 24, 1899 in Potosi, Springfield Township, York County, Pennsylvania to Emmanuel C. Ehrhart and Sarah Ann (Sallie) Zellers.

- Sidney was a member of Emmanuel United Brethren of Christ Church (which later became Winterstown United Methodist Church) for 81 years and a member of the church choir for 64 years.
- During the 50's and 60's she was employed at the Windy Hill Dairy Bar of Shrewsbury, PA.
- Her memberships included The Order of the Eastern Star, Shrewsbury Triangle Chapter 483, the Veterans of Foreign Wars - New Freedom Post 7012 Auxiliary, the Shrewsbury Fire Company Auxiliary, and the New Freedom Ambulance Club.
- She also enjoyed being a member of an active card club, her weekly trips to play bingo, the occasional bus trip, and of course her love of quilting.

- Sidney's husband George passed away on January 25, 1969 at the age of 72.
- Sidney passed away on June 19, 1994 at the age of 95. Both are buried at the Winterstown United Brethren Church Cemetery.



- Sidney was written up in this quilting publication about her red and white block design.
- They Said: "Please send me a block, my readers will love it!" Mrs. Glatfelter made up one of her "Arrow Blocks" to share with us. "Believe me, when many of these blocks are pieced together the visual effect is absolutely stunning."



From the same publication: "This Featured Reader block shows that the exciting color combination of red and white is just as appealing today as it was many years ago. The crisp contrast of these two colors creates a feeling of movement and rhythm."



1921 - 2012




- Jack B Clotfelter was born on March 17, 1921, in Harlan, Kentucky, to Homer B Clotfelter and Ida Winchester.
- He married Christine Elizabeth Chestnut in 1947 and they lived in Lexington, Kentucky.
- They had a daughter Paula Haynes.
- Jack's second wife was Patty who was his wife until his death on May 28, 2012, at the age of 91.

Jack B. Clotfelter

- Jack was an award winning architect and artist building a career spanning decades.
- He and his partner David M Samokar founded the Clotfelter/Samokar Architects Company in 1953 that earned a respected reputation for excellence in educational design.
- They designed more than 2,000 school projects throughout Kentucky and surrounding areas.
- Besides being an architect, Jack was also a painter whose work was watercolors on paper.

- Georgia was born upstairs in the adobe building that previously served as the Fort Verde officer's quarters in Camp Verde, Arizona, which is now a state historical museum.
- She was a great artist who composed over 100 paintings of mostly western scenes.
- Her husband was Frank Glotfelty, and they had four children, Marsha (Glotfelty) Smith, Mark Glotfelty, Marvin Glotfelty, and Mel Glotfelty.

Born Georgia Vaudene Reid her family were pioneers that made their way into the Arizona Territory in the early 1890s.



She and Frank Glotfelty married in March 27, 1947.

1960 - 2021



- Rebecca (Becky) was born on October 18, 1960 in Boston, MA, and spent her early childhood in Massachusetts, Maryland, and France.
- Her family moved to North Carolina when Becky was nine, and although she spent some time in other places, for the rest of her life she considered herself a North Carolinian.
- She graduated from Duke University in 1982 with a BA in Economics.

- She found her calling when she began studying and making art in the late 80's.
- Initially she was drawn to glass art, and Becky spent a year studying with master glass artist John Wallis in Pasadena, California.
- Returning to North Carolina, she attended UNCG, and graduated summa cum laude with a BFA in Painting.
- Becky experimented with other media including printmaking, collaging, fabric dyeing, and painting, and as time went on, painting became her primary focus.
- She was known for an incredible range of work: simple watercolors, still lifes, portraits, murals, and illustrations.

- She met her partner in life and art, her husband Jim Clodfelter, when they both worked at The Wind Rose, a decorative arts studio in Greensboro.
- Becky and Jim started their successful painting business (originally Clodfelter Specialty Painting, now Clodfelter Studio) in 1996, and ran it together until the week of Becky's death.
- The greatest joy of Becky's life was their son Jack. Born in 2004, he is himself is a remarkable artist.
- Becky loved nature in any form, and invariably noticed the smallest of insects, creatures, and flowers, which she often worked into her paintings, sometimes as subtle details that surprised and delighted viewers.

- It was discovered that Becky had ALS and she navigated her illness with the same grace, humor, courage and kindness that she brought to every circumstance.
- She was actively in charge of her own choices and care until her last day.
- In her own words: "There are good days and bad days. But... the things that help the most are not the medicines... it's the laughter I share with family and friends, the relaxed times together around the kitchen table and my own inner reflection on life's gifts so generously bestowed upon me."
- Becky passed on August 14, 2021.


Elizabeth "Libby" Glatfelter

1947 - 2021



- Libby Glatfelter was a contemporary artist who painted, and monotypes became her preferred media.
- She also enjoyed the mediums of print making.
- Libby became associated with jewelry construction later in life and was quite good at it.

Libby had her own studio in Jenkintown, Pa, 705 West, which featured her art, prints, and jewelry. She did a lot of wildlife portraits and commission portraits of customers pets.



- Libby was the president of the Crossing, an American professional chamber choir, conducted by Donald Nally and based in Philadelphia.
- It focuses on new music, commission and premiere works, and collaborates with various venues and instrumental ensembles.
- Upon her death, Libby gave a bequest of \$250,000 to the Crossing.
- The Crossing is also supported by the Anne M. and Philip Glatfelter, III Family Foundation.

- Libby earned a BA from Wheaton College and studied at the New York Studio School of Painting and Sculpture in the 1970's.
- In the 80's and 90's she ran a decorative painting business.
- She then took a jewelry metal smithing class and began making her jewelry from beading materials, semi-precious stones, bone, wood, vintage glass, African trade beads and even paper.
- Her daughter Cassandra Caldor is also an artist.
