The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Burglary-1st Deg-Dwelling-Occupied-Non-Accomplice Present Minnesota Statute: 609.582.1(a), with reference to: 609.582.1, 609.582.1a

Maximum Sentence: 20 YEARS AND/OR \$35,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 11/10/2022

Control #(ICR#): 22004274

Charge Description: That on or about November 10, 2022 at 4207 66th Ave N, Brooklyn Center in Hennepin County, Minnesota, DENNIS MICHAEL TILL, either directly or as an accomplice, entered a dwelling, without consent and with intent to commit a crime or committed a crime while in the dwelling and another person, Brandon Broszko and Lynsey Coleman, who was not an accomplice, was in the dwelling at any time while DENNIS MICHAEL TILL was in the dwelling.

Minimum Sentence: 6 MONTHS

COUNT II

Charge: Impersonating a peace officer - Intent to mislead another that impersonator is an officer

Minnesota Statute: 609.4751.1, with reference to: 609.101.4, 609.4751.1

Maximum Sentence: 90 DAYS AND/OR \$300-\$1,000

Offense Level: Misdemeanor

Offense Date (on or about): 11/10/2022

Charge Description: That on or about November 10, 2022 at 4207 66th Ave N, Brooklyn Center in Hennepin County, Minnesota, DENNIS MICHAEL TILL falsely impersonated a peace officer with intent to mislead another into believing that the impersonator was actually an officer.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

On November 10, 2022, officers from the Brooklyn Center Police Department were dispatched to a group home located at 4255 66th Ave. North, Brooklyn Center in Hennepin County, Minnesota for a report of an assault on a client of the group home. When the officers arrived, they observed a male group home client to be holding his head and blood coming out of it. The male was identified as DENNIS MICHAEL TILL (DOB: 04/07/1982), hereinafter Defendant. The officers observed the Defendant to be wearing a necklace with what appeared to be a law enforcement badge attached to it. The group home staff advised that a neighbor had hit the Defendant in the head with a branch-like stick. Paramedics responded to the scene, and the Defendant was transported to the hospital in an ambulance.

Officers attempted to obtain a recorded statement from the Defendant, but he refused. The defendant also refused to sign a medical information release form for the officers. While in the ambulance, the Defendant told the officers several different stories of what happened. First, the Defendant told the officers that he had went to a neighbor's house, later identified as the address of 4207 66th Ave N, Brooklyn Center, MN, to transfer some property there. Then, the Defendant changed his story and said that he was part of a federal agency and thought there was methamphetamine in the home, as well as a female being raped in the home.

Officers then went to the address of 4207 66th Ave. N, Brooklyn Center in Hennepin County, Minnesota, and met with the residents of the home Brandon Broszko and Lynsey Coleman, hereinafter "Victim 1" and "Victim 2." Victim 1 reported that he was laying on the couch, and he saw the front door fly open and the Defendant enter the home. Victim 1 recognized the Defendant as a client of the group home. Victim 1 said that the Defendant was wearing a police badge and stated that he was FBI and to "give me my meth." Victim 1 said he had no idea what the Defendant was talking about, as he did not have drugs in the house. Victim 1 said that he stood up and told the Defendant to leave his house, but that then the Defendant put on brass knuckles, got into a fighting stance with closed fists, and wanted to fight Victim 1. Victim 1 said he pushed the Defendant out his house.

Victim 1 reported that he then walked to the group home to talk with the group home staff about what had happened with the Defendant and grabbed a stick to protect himself since he knew that the Defendant was armed with brass knuckles. The Defendant had returned to the group home at this time. Victim 1 said that once he got to the doorway area of the group home, the Defendant stood up, put on the brass knuckles and took a fighting stance again. Victim 1 said that's when he threw the stick and it may have hit the Defendant. Victim 1 left the group home and Victim 2 called 911.

Victim 2 reported that the Defendant had been on their property numerous times and that their children are in fear of the Defendant due to his behavior. Victim 2 said that the school bus won't drive down their street to pick the children up for school anymore due to the Defendant because the Defendant had previously gotten onto the school bus and called the children racial slurs. Victim 2 said that other individuals are in fear of the Defendant in the neighborhood too.

An officer obtained a statement from the group home nurse who was in charge at the time the Defendant was hit with the stick by Victim 1. The nurse, Kona Norris, reported that he noticed the Defendant wanted to go outside and predicted that the Defendant was getting ready to leave for somewhere due to his past experience with the Defendant. Norris advised that he went inside for approximately 5 to 6 minutes and that when he came back outside, he saw the neighbor Victim 1 walking up pointing the stick at the Defendant

and saying "do you know him, do you know this guy." At that time, Victim 1 hit the Defendant with the Victim 1 then left and Norris called 911.

The officers were provided a diagnoses sheet that the Defendant is schizophrenic and has other significant mental health issues. A Hennepin County MAARC report for adult protection was then filed.

A warrant is requested for the Defendant's arrest.
